

## Kimberley Shines in Singapore with Sheffield

Sheffield Resources shone a light on Western Australia's rich cultural heritage as it presented symbols of the Kimberley to customers of its Thunderbird Mineral Sands Project at the TZMI Mineral Sands Conference in Singapore.

A remote region in north-west Australia and home to over 30 traditional Aboriginal language groups, the Kimberley is host to the Thunderbird Project. With a history stretching back tens of thousands of years, the Kimberley is rich in artwork, ceremony, song, story and dance. Against an extraordinary ancient landscape is woven a remarkable account of Aboriginal culture, and Sheffield's global customers have a piece to take home.

Sheffield has forged relationships with local Aboriginal artists, and proudly presented their artworks to customers from China, Europe, India and Malaysia at a cocktail event during the TZMI mineral sands conference in Singapore.

Supporting local Kimberley Aboriginal artists Patrina Bedford, Tanisha Wungundin-Allies and Edna Dale, their works in traditional dot-painting style were very well received.

"Aboriginal art and culture is of enormous importance, and highly regarded. The presentation of these artworks is a meaningful way for Sheffield to mark the foundation of our long-term trading relationships," said Bruce McFadzean, Managing Director Sheffield Resources.

Each evocative artwork was presented with an image of the artist, the story of the art work and insights into local Aboriginal culture.
