Voting eligibility

The Directors have determined pursuant to Regulation 7.11.37 of the Corporations Regulations 2001 (Cth) that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered Shareholders at 4:00pm (WST) on 3 February 2016.

Voting in person

To vote in person, attend the Meeting at the time, date and place set out above.

Voting by proxy

To vote by proxy, please complete and sign the enclosed Proxy Form and return by the time and in accordance with the instructions set out on the Proxy Form.

In accordance with section 249L of the Corporations Act, Shareholders are advised that:

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. BACKGROUND

1.1 Appointments - Managing Director and Thunderbird Project Manager

On 26 October 2015, the Company announced the appointment of Mr Bruce McFadzean as Managing Director of the Company.

On 16 November 2015, the Company announced the appointment of Mr Jim Netterfield as Project Manager to the Company's Thunderbird mineral sands project.

As part of the remuneration packages agreed for each of Messrs McFadzean and Netterfield, the Company has agreed, subject to Shareholder approval, to issue Options to each of Messrs McFadzean and Netterfield (or their respective nominees).

Resolutions 1 and 2 seek Shareholder approval for the issue of Options to Messrs McFadzean and Netterfield (or their respective nominees) in accordance with the terms of their employment.

1.2 Capital raising

On 27 November 2015, the Company announced the Board had resolved to raise up to \$5,000,000 by way of a placement of up to 11,400,000 Shares at an issue price of \$0.44 per Share to domestic and international institutional, sophisticated and professional investors. The Company subsequently completed the issue of 10,913,886 Shares on 8 and 11 December 2015 to raise a total of \$4,802,109.84 (**Placement**).

In addition, the Company announced the Board had resolved to raise up to a further \$2,000,000 through offers to eligible Shareholders to participate in a share purchase plan (SPP).

The funds raised pursuant to the Placement and SPP will be used to:

- (a) undertake a high quality Bankable Feasibility Study at Thunderbird;
- (b) to accelerate off take and financial negotiations;
- (c) to undertake regional exploration at the Dampier Mineral Sands project and the Red Bull Nickel Project (Fraser Range); and
- (d) for general working capital purposes.

The Directors wish to subscribe for an aggregate of \$167,640 of Shares on the same terms as Shares have been issued to unrelated investors under the Placement and SPP. Resolutions 4 to 7 seek Shareholder approval for the issue of Shares to each of the Directors (or their respective nominees).

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ISSUE OF OPTIONS – BRUCE MCFADZEAN

2.1 General

As noted in Section 1.1, the Company has agreed, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval, to issue Options to Mr Bruce McFadzean (or his nominee/s) on the terms and conditions set out below.

The Options to be issued comprise 368,444 Remuneration Options and 3,000,000 Performance Options (together the **Director Options**). The Director Options are subject to vesting conditions as set out in Schedule 2. In the event of resignation or termination of Mr McFadzean's employment with the Company unvested Options will lapse other than where termination occurs due to redundancy or without cause in which case the Remuneration Options automatically vest.

The quantity of Remuneration Options was determined by dividing \$175,000 by the 30 day volume weighted average market price of Shares up to and including 14 December 2015 (being \$0.47947).

Resolution 1 seeks Shareholder approval for the issue of the Director Options to Mr Bruce McFadzean (or his nominee/s).

2.2 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

For a public company, or an entity that the public company controls, to give a financial benefit to a related party of the public company, the public company or entity must:

- (a) obtain the approval of the public company's members in the manner set out in sections 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

The issue of Director Options constitutes giving a financial benefit and Mr Bruce McFadzean is a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director.

The Directors (other than Mr Bruce McFadzean who has a material personal interest in the Resolution) consider that Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is not required in respect of the issue of Director Options because the agreement to issue the Director Options, reached as part of the remuneration package for Mr Bruce McFadzean, is considered reasonable remuneration in the circumstances and was negotiated on an arm's length basis as part of agreeing the terms of his appointment.

2.3 ASX Listing Rule 10.11

ASX Listing Rule 10.11 also requires shareholder approval to be obtained where an entity issues, or agrees to issue, securities to a related party, or a person whose relationship with the entity or a related party is, in ASX's opinion, such that approval should be obtained unless an exception in ASX Listing Rule 10.12 applies.

As the issue of the Director Options involves the issue of securities to a related party of the Company, Shareholder approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 10.11 is required

unless an exception applies. It is the view of the Directors that the exceptions set out in ASX Listing Rule 10.12 do not apply in the current circumstances.

2.4 Technical Information required by ASX Listing Rule 10.13

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 10.13, the following information is provided in relation to Resolution 1:

- (a) the Director Options will be issued to Mr Bruce McFadzean (or his nominee/s);
- (b) the number of Director Options to be issued is 3,368,444, comprising 368,444 Remuneration Options and 3,000,000 Performance Options;
- (c) the Director Options will be issued no later than 1 month after the date of the Meeting (or such later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the ASX Listing Rules);
- (d) the Director Options will be issued for nil cash consideration, accordingly no funds will be raised; and
- (e) the terms and conditions of the Director Options are set out in Schedule 1.

Approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 is not required for the issue of the Director Options as approval is being obtained under ASX Listing Rule 10.11. Accordingly, the issue of Director Options to Mr Bruce McFadzean (or his nominee/s) will not be included in the use of the Company's 15% annual placement capacity pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – ISSUE OF OPTIONS – JIM NETTERFIELD

3.1 General

As noted in Section 1.1, the Company has agreed, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval, to issue Options to Mr Jim Netterfield (or his nominee/s) on the terms and conditions set out below.

The Options to be issued comprise 105,269 Remuneration Options and 700,000 Performance Options (together the **Manager Options**). The Manager Options are subject to vesting conditions as set out in Schedule 2. In the event of resignation or termination of Mr Netterfield's employment with the Company unvested Options will lapse other than where termination occurs due to redundancy or without cause in which case the Remuneration Options automatically vest.

The quantity of Remuneration Options was determined by dividing \$50,000 by the 30 day volume weighted average market price of Shares up to and including 14 December 2015 (being \$0.47947).

Resolution 2 seeks Shareholder approval for the issue of the Manager Options to Mr Jim Netterfield (or his nominee/s).

3.2 ASX Listing Rule 7.1

ASX Listing Rule 7.1 provides that a company must not, subject to specified exceptions, issue or agree to issue more equity securities during any 12 month period than that amount which represents 15% of the number of fully paid ordinary securities on issue at the commencement of that 12 month period.

The effect of Resolution 2 will be to allow the Company to issue the Manager Options during the period of 3 months after the Meeting (or a longer period, if allowed by ASX), without using the Company's 15% annual placement capacity.

3.3 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.1

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.3, the following information is provided in relation to Resolution 2:

- (a) the maximum number of Manager Options to be issued is 805,269 comprising 105,269 Remuneration Options and 700,000 Performance Options;
- (b) the Manager Options will be issued no later than 3 months after the date of the Meeting (or such later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the ASX Listing Rules) and it is intended that issue of the Manager Options will occur on the same date;
- (c) the Manager Options will be issued for nil cash consideration, accordingly no funds will be raised:
- (d) the Manager Options will be issued to Mr Jim Netterfield, who is not a related party of the Company, or his nominee/s; and
- (e) the Manager Options will be issued on the terms and conditions set out in Schedule 2.

4. RESOLUTION 3 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF SHARES

4.1 General

Resolution 3 seeks Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Shares the subject of the Placement as referred to in Section 1.2 (Ratification).

A summary of ASX Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 3.2.

ASX Listing Rule 7.4 sets out an exception to ASX Listing Rule 7.1. It provides that where a company in general meeting ratifies the previous issue of securities made pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 (and provided that the previous issue did not breach ASX Listing Rule 7.1) those securities will be deemed to have been made with shareholder approval for the purpose of ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

By ratifying this issue, the Company will retain the flexibility to issue equity securities in the future up to the 15% annual placement capacity set out in ASX Listing Rule 7.1 without the requirement to obtain prior Shareholder approval.

4.2 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.4

- (d) the Shares were issued to institutional, sophisticated and professional investors. None of these subscribers are related parties of the Company; and
- (e) the funds raised from this issue are being used for the purposes set out in Section 1.2.

5. RESOLUTIONS 4 TO 7 – SUBSCRIPTION FOR SHARES BY RELATED PARTIES

5.1 General

The Directors (**Related Parties**) (or their nominees) wish to subscribe for Shares at the same price as has been issued by the Company under teh Placement and SPP (**Subscription**).

Resolutions 4 to 7, seek Shareholder approval for the issue of up to 381,000 Shares to the Related Parties arising from the Subscription.

5.2 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

A summary of Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is set out in Section 2.2.

The Subscription will result in the issue of Shares which constitutes giving a financial benefit and the Related Parties are related parties of the Company by virtue of each being a Director.

5.3 ASX Listing Rule 10.11

A summary of Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is set out in Section 2.3.

As the Subscription involves the issue of Shares to related parties of the Company, Shareholder approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 10.11 is required unless an exception applies. It is the view of the Directors that the exceptions set out in ASX Listing Rule 10.12 do not apply in the current circumstances.

5.4 Technical Information required by ASX Listing Rule 10.13

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 10.13, the following information is provided in relation to the Subscription:
